Discover the starkly beautiful Falkland Islands, walk the wild shores of South Georgia and Shackleton's Elephant Island, and explore the Antarctic Peninsula during five days of expeditionary Zodiac cruising and landings. Voyage I: Port Moresby to Manado

February 15 – March 6, 2010

Cruise from New Guinea's fascinating Asmat villages to the northern tip of Sulawesi Island. Explore the Raja Ampat archipelago—whose seas, part of the fabled Coral Triangle, are considered to hold the richest species variety

on the planet. Sail the breathtaking coast of the MacCluer Gulf, visiting remote tribal villages, and, during two days in the spectacular volcanic Halmahera Islands, make expedition stops to visit its villages and snorkel and dive in the rich waters. Across the Sea of Maluku, investigate the waters of Bunaken National Marine Park, a World Heritage Site protecting thousands of bird, coral, and fish species. Voyage II: Manado to Bali

Orchid-shaped Sulawesi is home to a phenomenal variety of flora, fauna, and marine life—as well as some of the most fascinating cultures in the world. Expedition highlights include Bunaken Marine Park, home to nearly 70 percent of all fish species known

to the Indo-western Pacific region; a visit to a nature reserve where we look for crested black macaques, and cus cus, small rodent-like animals; and the Togean Islands, an equatorial paradise of dense jungle, coral reefs, and isolated atolls. In the highlands of Toraja view the unique boat-shaped architecture and cliff-side graves marked by life-sized effigies. Walk in Komodo National Park and watch for the world's largest lizard, the Komodo dragon, and snorkel or dive in the Flores Sea. Bali's magical atmosphere pervades its verdant landscapes, temples, and towns and offers a fitting finale to this grand voyage. From: \$9,380 per person, double occupancy



BURMA & LAOS

Snorkel and dive the clear waters of the Celebes Sea, enjoy the traditional hospitality of the Dayak people in Kalimantan, and in Sabah, observe gentle orangutans at one of the largest ape rehabilitation centers in the world. cape buffalo, Nile crocodiles, and the world's largest concentrations of hippos. The numerous species of primates are, of course, a star attraction and nowhere else can travelers witness and photograph, at such close range, the variety that exists here. On safari drives and trekking excursions, we go in search of troops of chimpanzees, red and white colobus monkeys, and mangabeys. An expedition highlight is our three-day stay in Bwindi National Park where we have the privilege of observing Uganda's iconic mountain gorillas in their natural habitat. Enjoy a leisurely bicycle ride through emerald rice fields, buy silks in the centers where they are woven, photograph bustling colorful markets, sample delicious culinary delights as you cruise down the Perfume River in painted dragon boats, and meet the lovely people who welcome us with warmth and friendship. For nature lovers, the range of landscapes and biodiversity is inspiring. On sub-tropical islands and in sub-alpine forests, along city-hemmed harbors and serene pine-shaded coves, we watch for wildlife and search for rare and endemic birds with our experts. Our voyage also takes us walking in heather-smothered moorlands, through the magnificent geological wonderland of Giant's Causeway, and among the ruins of fortress-castles that echo the lore of the Celts and Anglo-Saxons. From the sub-tropical gardens on the Isles of Scilly to the sacred sites of the Inner Hebrides and the stark beauty of Fair Isle, our unique itinerary captures the ancient spirit and wild heart of Britain. BEYOND MICRONESIA

In combination, our two adventure-packed voyages span nearly 4,000 miles of the North and South Pacific Oceans and visit seven far-flung island nations. Each offers rare opportunities to discover an extravagance of natural wonders and enjoy highly personal cultural encounters.



Voyage I: Guam to Pohnpei
August 26 – September 8, 2010

Tiny islets, mangrove-canopied channels, and emerald lagoons distinguish the Federated States of Micronesia and we begin with an exploration of the traditional island group of Yap. Zodiacs whisk us to the shores of spectacular atolls where villagers welcome us with drums and

dances. Naturalist-led walks reveal profuse birdlife and rare botanicals, and snorkeling and diving showcases coral reefs teeming with life. The rugged volcanic Truk Islands are known for WWII shipwrecks; on shore, birders watch for the rare Truk greater white-eye. Lush Pohnpei is a paradise of waterfalls and flora and we explore its 92 megalithic man-made islands, once the residence of royalty. From: \$8,980 per person, double occupancy



Voyage II: Pohnpei to Fiji
September 6 – 21, 2010

From the volcanic and verdant island of Pohnpei in Micronesia we sail eastward into the Marshall Islands, a collage of low-lying coral atolls bathed by crystal clear waters. Snorkeling and diving, walks along pristine sands, and a chance to meet the Marshallese who are renowned

for superb navigational skills and ingenious canoe, or *ua*, construction are highlights. We witness the scene of WWII battles fought on Butaritari Atoll in the Kiribati Islands, then head to the picture-perfect Polynesian islands of Tuvalu and the tiny capital, Funafuti, where we are greeted by lively dances. Fiji's Taveuni and Lautoka, with their exquisite gardens and bird-haven rain forests complete our adventure. From: \$9,980 per person, double occupancy

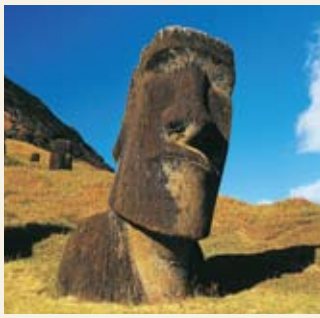
