SEE Bring yourself up to date on Australia's two-century history at the **Immigration Museum**, where true-life stories are told through poignant memorabilia and interactive displays. • At the **National Gallery**, view the country's finest collection of traditional paintings and native Koorie art. • Explore the food halls, open sheds, and stores of the 19th-century "**Queen Vic**" **Market**, whose buildings are preserved by the National Trust.

DO Pose for photos in front of elegant **Flinders Station**, then stroll up Flinders Lane for a retrospective of both European and Aboriginal painters showcased in the dozens of fabulous brick warehouses-turned-galleries. • Spend a few leisurely hours Melbourne-style, enjoying some of the city's exalted gardens. The amazing floral display in the conservatory at the **Fitzroy Gardens** was designed by James Sinclair, who planted Czar Nicholas's Royal Gardens in the Crimea. **Cook's Cottage** was brought over from England and reconstructed, brick by brick. And across the street the **Treasury Gardens**, laid out in 1867, highlight a spectacular rose garden and the President Kennedy Memorial. • Pause for coffee at the famous see-and-be-seen **Café Segovia** in Block Place.

SHOP Find fashion nirvana at **South Yarra Chapel Street**, where original Australian clothing, jewelry, shoes, and art designs are showcased. Tiny boutiques such as Collette Dinnigan, Dinosaur Designs, and Dolci Firme yield enticing image treasures. • At **Melbourne Central**, 160 specialty stores – including the famed international Fairmaru – sit in the heart of the city. The huge Marionette Fob Watch plays Waltzing Mathilda on the hour. • In the **Banana Alley Vault**, built under the viaduct beside the Yarra River, shop for souvenirs and local delicacies.

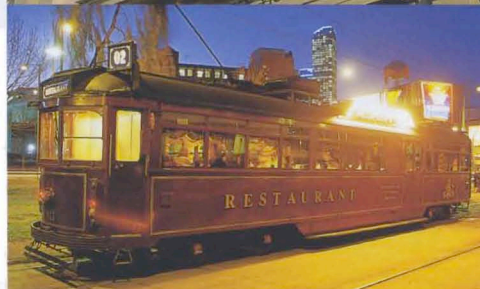
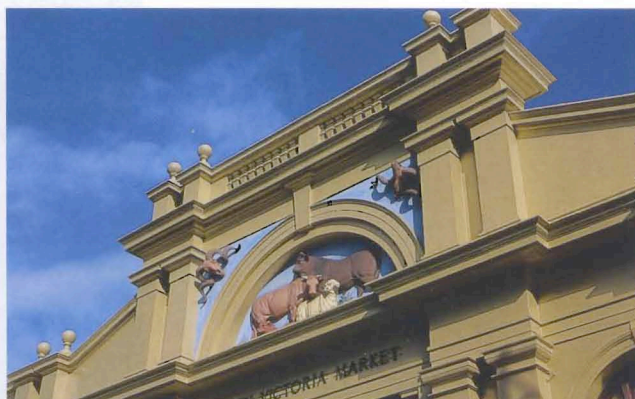

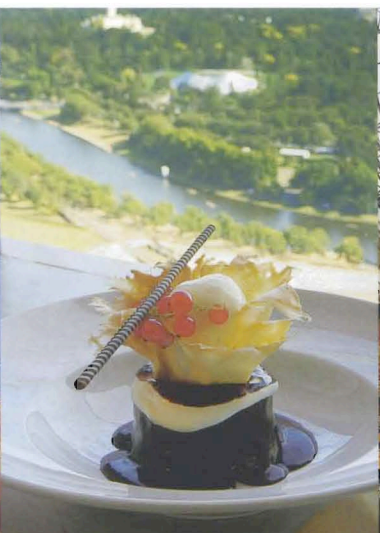
EAT Excellent dining and a choice of international cuisine are Melbourne hallmarks.
